

Wing Commander Nigel Randall RAF (Retired), MRAeS, JP



Nigel Randall was born and raised on a council estate in Nuneaton, Warwickshire in 1951. He joined the Royal Air Force in 1969 straight from senior school. The flying element of his RAF career lasted some 20 years when he flew as navigator and instructor on 2-seat jet aircraft such as the Canberra on 85, 100 and 360 Squadrons and the F4 Phantom Air Defence aircraft on 29 and 92 Squadrons and the Phantom Standards and Evaluation Unit in Germany. Wing Commander Randall then completed 16 years as an RAF staff officer undertaking various specialised appointments in contingency and crisis response planning. In 1993 he became Military Assistant to the 3* Commandant of the NATO Defence College, Rome, where he was responsible for protocol to Head of State level. Immediately prior to retirement he was a member of the Directing Staff

of the UK Defence Academy responsible for teaching and syllabus writing duties. Nigel lives in Adderbury with his physiotherapist wife, Gill. He now devotes his time supporting and promoting the local voluntary and community sector through his work with the Rotary Club of Banbury, as trustee and director of Cherwell Community & Voluntary Services and as local District Councillor and Justice of the Peace. He is a member of the St James Branch of the British Legion, and became President of the Adderbury and Milton Branch in April 2014.
